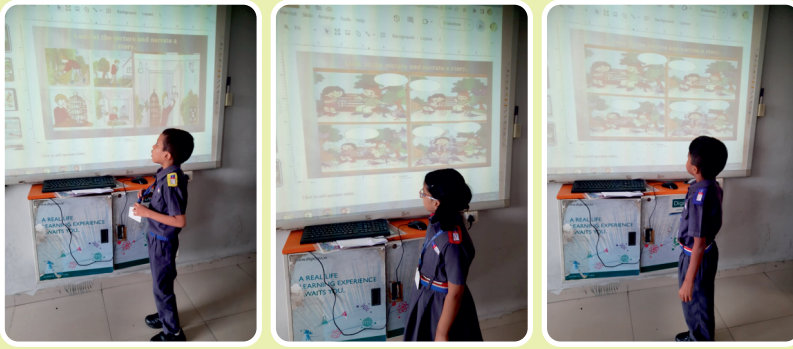
Summer STARS: Celebrating Creativity
